The aim of the workshop is to use a rigorous 'Design Charette' process to facilitate a structured but innovative design space around a mock Ecotourism Facility on an existing building and site. Participants will gain first hand experience in the Design Charette process as a tool to bring about improved outcomes in sustainability in ecotourism facilities. The Workshop will be a combination of contextual presentations, facilitated sessions, a site visit and walk-through. The Charette will encourage discussion and concept planning between delegates. It will be of relevance to delegates involved in the planning and refurbishment of eco-tourism facilities, from technical design experts (eg engineering, architecture, planning etc), to community representatives, local government and business. This will include consideration of aspects such as renewable energy, eco-efficiency, adaptation to climate change, ecotourism accreditation/certification, facilities management and marketing.
